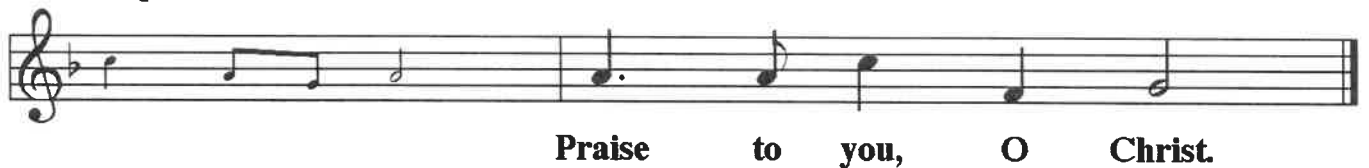
*GOSPEL:




