### \*REMEMBRANCE OF BAPTISM





P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint John, the 10th Chapter.


## C: Glory to you, O Lord!





# Paul Phillip Zinnecker Obituary

Paul Phillip Zinnecker, a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, passed away on Sunday, October 19, 2025, at the age of 67 in Hampstead, North Carolina.

Paul was born on December 2, 1957, in Cincinnati, Ohio, where he spent much of his life before retiring and moving to the North Carolina coast. He built a successful career at Cincinnati Bell, Kroger, and Kaivac; and a beautiful family, leaving a legacy of warmth and dedication. While he may not have been a man of many words, Paul was known for his selflessness, kindness, and gentle spirit, and his unwavering support for those he loved. Everyone who met him immediately knew he was a good and godly man.

Throughout his life, Paul wore many, many titles:

Son, grandson, brother, brother-in-law, uncle, great-uncle, cousin, nephew, son-in-law; athlete, distance runner, mentor; Telephone Test Desk Technician, Six Sigma Master Black Belt, Project Manager; Stephen Minister, Financial Peace University Facilitator, Sound Board Technician, IH Boosters President, and IH Recreation Commission President; friend, jokester, coach, Bengals, Reds, and Buckeyes fan.

Two very important titles to him were Child of God and Brother in Christ.

He cherished the titles of Best Friend and Husband of Jan (nee Eckenfels); Dad of Alicia, Diana, and Colleen; and Father-in-law of Shawn Stacy and Lee Hewitt.

But, his ABSOLUTE FAVORITE titles were "Blue Mush" to Phillip and Graham, and "Papa" to Finnley. They will all three miss his playful spirit and calming, steady, and comforting presence.

Paul will be remembered by his family and friends as a man of integrity, generosity, and humor. While he will be deeply missed, his family takes comfort in knowing he is at peace in the arms of Jesus, and that the love he shared will continue to guide them and show up in many various and unexpected ways through all those whose lives he touched.

A visitation will be held on Tuesday, October 28, 2025, from 9:00-11:00 AM, until time of funeral service at 11:00 AM, at Spring Grove Funeral Homes, 4389 Spring Grove Ave., Cincinnati, OH 45223. Burial will immediately follow at Spring Grove Cemetery. After the burial, there will be a light luncheon at the Spring Grove Event Center.
